Bunbury Boards

I can confirm that our company manufactures Bunbury Boards.

The Bunbury Boards are made from Irish hardwood timber using a range of species including oak, ash, elm, sycamore, birch, beech, chestnut and a range of other native trees.

We only use timber from trees grown on the island of Ireland. The traceability number on the reverse side of the board identifies the exact location of the tree from which that particular board was made. This can be checked on-line at our website – www.bunburyboards.com.

In the case of products known to be destined for Australia all of our timber is heat treated, inspected for insects and bark is removed. The timber is:

- heat treated in our kiln driers to 10 % (+/-2%) Moisture Content before entering the workshop.
- inspected for any signs of insect infestation – none is tolerated.
- the bark itself is removed carefully (where products have a waney edge - also known as “live edge” or “bark edge”). Sapwood may remain.

Our boards are exported around the world to several countries, including USA, Canada, Europe and Japan and they are accepted in those countries with no further treatment required.
